The Main Barn work began on the 18th May, with the contracted builders arriving with a few machines, harris fencing and three men! The men started digging and digging and shifting soil around. A huge sigh of relief was



heard audibly when the huge lump in the back left of the barn turned out not to be a massive granite rock, but just pure, soft malleable Dartmoor soil!

Volunteers had removed all the internal wood, preparing the space ready for future work, a new roof, new floors, insulation, new drains and heating. Oh yes – this will be one of Dartmoor's warmest and cosiest places!

9th September the new roof

trusses were swung into place on the end of a huge crane.

By October the upstairs interior with its new roof was laid out with the frames for boarding, layers of insulation and new velux and arrow slit windows in the





walls to allow light into each of

the five rooms. Serena and Julia visited multiple bathroom shops just before the second lock-down, so that orders could be made in time. Will, working closely with the builders prioritised ground work to ensure the drive and car parking area was completed before the winter rain drew in, ensuring the grass seed was laid in time for a thick flourish before the rain could wash top soil away. The aim is for the builders to complete by March...... then the serious work begins. We need to paint, decorate and furnish the Main Barn. We have not yet raised the funds, nor identified the skilled volunteer labour....... Can you help?
